**Please remember that this is a wellness schedule and if your pet ever becomes ill, additional examinations and diagnostic tests will be necessary.**

**Seventy-five percent of pets over the age of three have dental disease.** Dogs and cats are not supposed to have bad breath. Dental plaque, oral diseases, and other conditions can cause bad breath. Brushing your pet's teeth and having regular dental cleanings are beneficial for your pet and your pocketbook. Advanced dental diseases can be painful to your pet and costly to treat.

## "Senior at Seven"

Pets age much faster than people do. Most pets are considered seniors at seven years of age. Cats should visit a veterinarian once or twice a year throughout their lives.

- ### Preferred Senior Wellness Tests

  - \_\_\_\_\_ Abdominal radiographs
